Saint John Paul II once said that what was important about him was not the fact that he was the pope. What was more important was the fact that he was baptized.

I hope and pray that, even though the Christmas Season ends today, we may remain a constant and strong, warm and bright light for the world by the way we live our baptism every day of our lives.


