Readings for Sunday May 28, 2017

Acts 1:1-11/Ps 47:2-3, 6-9/ Eph 1:17-23/Mt 28:16-20



Today we hear Jesus preparing His friends for His departure. He reminds them that they are not being abandoned and left as "orphans." Jesus tells them that, with his passing, a new relationship begins.

Jesus has loved His friends and will intensify that love even to the death on the Cross. He reminds His early Church that they will continue to have a way to love Him. Notice once more, God loves us first, in Christ, and our response has to be in human terms, human expressions. Jesus reminds them that loving Him is revealed through keeping, not only the famous Ten Commandments, but the even more human commandment of loving one another.

Our Easter Season at Ascension is filled with celebrating Sacraments in our church — Baptisms, First Communions, Reconciliation, Marriages and Confirmation. We are doing what the Church is, the very actions of Jesus' taking flesh.

The Sacraments, which are the gestures of Jesus extended into time and according to human experiences, are given as gifts to be lived as part of the new relationship between God and us. The reception of the Sacraments is but a beginning. We are all called by the various Sacraments to BE sacraments, or visible, lively, loving presences of Jesus in the important times of the lives of our family—God's family.

This Thursday, May 25th, we celebrate the **Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord**, a holyday of obligation and our parish Feast Day. We will celebrate Mass at 7:00 and 8:30am and 7:30pm. Our 7:30pm will be our solemn Feast Day Mass which will be followed by our "Make your own Ice Cream Sundae" reception on Ascension Plaza. Please join us.

On Friday, May 26th, we begin our **Novena for Pentecost**—nine days of prayer asking God to renew us, our parish, and our world with the gift of the Holy Spirit. We will pray the Novena prayer, which is inserted in the back cover of our hymnals, at all daily and weekend Masses after the Universal Prayer.
