Readings for Sunday July 9, 2017

Zec 9:9-10/Ps 145:1-2, 8-11, 13-14/Rom 8:9, 11-13/Mt 11:25-30



Our reading from the Gospel forces us once again to look at a very basic building block of the spiritual life. We call that building block 'detachment'. It would be difficult to find anything more important for the health of our lives as Christians. And that's why it's critical that, from time to time, we take a second look at what detachment means in our lives. It can refer to the man or woman who is too attached to his or her career, the person who is overly attached to alcohol, or food, or other substances, the young person who is too attached to pleasure. The list has no end.

The important thing is for us to recognize when an attachment has gained control over our lives. Then we can start the process of detachment from the negative influences in our lives. But remember, we must then have a healthy attachment. In the Gospel, Jesus gives us the ultimate attachment. "Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me." Jesus is asking us to be, first and foremost, attached to him. Nothing, absolutely nothing, not even your family, must come in the way of your attachment and belonging to Jesus. There you have it - as clear and bold as daylight.

All of this means that proper detachment leads to proper attachment. If we are simply detached from everything and attached to nothing and no one, we are in some kind of strange space. Jesus calls us to be as strongly attached to him as we possibly can. Our attachment to the Lord will involve carrying our cross. It will also mean that we will lose our lives, in the sense that we will no longer have the last say about what we are going to do with them. Our lives will be totally directed by our relationship to Jesus Christ.

Words cannot adequately express my thanks to everyone who helped me celebrate my 40th Anniversary of Ordination to the Priesthood of Jesus Christ. These 40 years have certainly been an experience of God's writing straight with crooked lines. There have been so many twists and turns which brought me to this past weekend.

To my family and friends who came from near and far, my parishioners from the many parishes where I have been privileged to minister, especially here at Ascension, THANK YOU FOR THE FAITH, HOPE AND LOVE YOU HAVE SHARED WITH ME. You are all so very special to me.

Let me, on behalf of all of our parishioners, offer a BIG Thank You to Glenn Gordon and the members of our choirs. All year long you share your time and talents with us. You help us each week to raise our voices in praise to God. Please know that your efforts are recognized and appreciated. Enjoy your summer and come back refreshed!

This leads me to offer my gratitude to all of our parish liturgical, word, service, and community building ministers who, like Jesus, help people — you and me — to experience God's amazing love. They offer so many opportunities for everyone to more fully participate in God's love by getting involved, sharing our gifts, and helping others to experience God's love. I pray that you will all have an opportunity to relax a little this summer and renew yourselves for continued ministry in the Lord Jesus.

I also pray that many more of our parishioners will let the Holy Spirit lead them to see the needs of our parish and answer God's call to ministry here in Ascension. Remember, you cannot spell or be $CH\underline{U}RCH$, without \underline{U} in it!

This Tuesday we observe **Independence Day**, our nation's two hundred forty-first birthday. We will celebrate Mass at 8:30am. Together at the Lord's Table, as we conclude the Fortnight for Freedom, we will give thanks for God's blessings on our nation, especially the freedom of religion that we share as Americans. 
